Sports and PE Premium

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government has provided additional funding for Primary schools to improve their provision of PE and sport for the school years 2021-2022.

The money has been provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It has been allocated to primary school headteachers.

Purpose of funding

Schools can only use the sports premium for improving their provision of PE and sport but have the freedom to choose how they do this. In the current school year 2022-2023 the Government provided OLSG with £19,080 and highlighted the following areas where it could be used;

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports teachers/sports champion coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- taking part in more sports competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport for our PE Scheme of Work GetSet4PE

How have we allocated the Sports Premium and who will it benefit?

The Governors agree that the money must be used so that: all children benefit regardless of their sporting ability; that the most talented children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments that all children have access to competitions; our focus this year with WF was the inclusion of SEN children within competitions as well as a focus on girls football. Also that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development.

The impact of the PE premium has enabled our school to:

- PE embedded as part of the culture of the school
- Our staff deliver PE as part of the curriculum as well as other initiatives like 'Go Noodle', '5 as Day' and 'Mile a day'. Teachers encourage children to use PE techniques before a non-PE lesson, to get children engaged, active and ready for learning.
- To offer a varied extra-curricular sports activities- delivered by both external and internal staff members. We have worked hard to change our choices to suit the year group or trend, to try to target and engage the children who are not accessing any activities and will continue to do so.
- To enhance our outdoor areas in stages, FS, and now continuing to assess and moving onto KS1
- Post Covid, we continued to promote various online PE resources through google classroom.
